- Evening witness a cultural show.
- Overnight stay at hotel.

DAY 03: Kandy / Peradeniya / Tea Plantation / Nuwara Eliya (B)

- After Breakfast visit Peradeniya Gardens
- Later departure to Nuwara Eliya. En route visit a tea plantation and a tea factory, where the best tea in the world is produced.
- Afternoon, visit Nuwara Eliya, Sri Lankas most popular hill resort.
- Overnight stay at hotel.

DAY 04: Nuwara Eliya / Kataragama (B)

- After Breakfast leave for Kataragama
- Afternoon visit Kataragama
- Overnight stay at hotel.



DAY 05: Kataragama / Galle (B)

- After Breakfast leave for Galle, the chief port of Ceylon. visit the Galle Fort which is a World Heritage Site.

DAY 06: Galle / Colombo (B)

- After breakfast depart for Colombo. Enroute visit Pinnawala Elephant Orphanage.
- Afternoon do a city tour & shopping tour of Colombo.

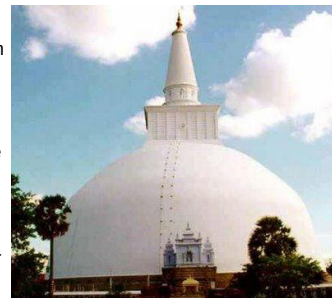

COMPREHENSIVE SIGHTS & ACTIVITIES :

• **Pinnawala Elephant Orphanage**, established in 1975, commenced with seven orphans. Today some of these orphans enjoy the fortune of seeing their grandchildren born in the same location. The original objective of establishing the orphanage inclined more towards tourism, but is soon became a conservation and educational centre. With the help of local and foreign elephant experts, Pinnawala started a scientific captive-breeding programme for elephants. The free movement of the herd enhanced the chances for respective individuals of both sexes to get together and mate. The nearby river played a dominant role in this regard, and in 1984, the first baby of Pinnawala was born.



• **Kandy** was the last capital of the Sri Lankan kings and is a World Heritage Site. The name "Kandy" conjures visions of splendour and magnificence. Many of the legends, traditions and folklore are still lovingly kept alive. Drive around the Kandy lake built by the last Sinhala king, Sri Wickrama Rajasinghe in 1798. Visit the Kandy town and bazaar, the arts and crafts centre, a gem museum and a lapidary. Also visit the Temple of the Tooth Relic in Kandy.

• **Cultural Show in Kandy** : This cultural show is about the Dance was that was initiated in Sri Lanka during the 4th century B.C for the purpose of expelling natural disasters, sickness and greet people and land. The classical dance forms are associated with the performance of various rituals and ceremonies which are centuries old and are based on the folk religion and folk beliefs going back to times before the advent and acceptance of Buddhism by the Sinhalese people

• **Peradeniya** botanical garden was first built as a pleasure garden by a Sinhala king and was expanded by the British. It is 147 acres in extent and provides an amazing variety of trees, plants and flowers.

• **Galle** was once the chief port of Ceylon. It is still well known for hand-made lace. You can also visit the Galle Fort (spanning 90 acres) which was originally built by the Portuguese and later extended by the Dutch in 1663. This is a World Heritage Site.

• **Kataragama** centers around the repeated descent and exploits on earth of a hero (Kataragama) and his battles with the forces of darkness. According to this basic symbolic framework, a number of themes are woven in depending on the perspective taken - whether it be Buddhism, where Kataragama is the bodhisattva or Buddha to be or Hinduism where according to legend, Skanda, the Hindu God of War arrived in Sri Lanka and received two gifts from the Sinhalese - a house of leaves and a beautiful wife. It is the romantic union of Skanda and his wife that is commemorated annually.

• **Nuwara Eliya**, because of its invigorating mountain climate and scenery, is Sri Lankas most popular hill resort. Nuwara Eliya is also the heart of Sri Lankas tea country producing a significant share of the world's best tea. Sri Lanka's highest mountain Pidurutalagala (8282 feet) is located here. Nuwara Eliya also has one of the finest 18 hole golf courses in South Asia. Enroute to Nuwara Eliya you will visit a tea plantation and a tea factory, where the best tea in the world is produced. Here you could observe all about the process of manufacturing tea. You can also see how tea is graded. Taste a cup of pure Ceylon tea in the factory.

• **Colombo** like many capital cities in developing countries is fast changing its face. Almost overnight, skyscrapers arise from where old buildings once stood. Yet in some parts, the old world charm is retained. For example, there is a 100-year-old clock tower and several British built colonial buildings. Other places of interest are the Pettah bazaar - where one can shop for bargain, a Hindu and a Buddhist temple, residential areas where you find the stately homes of the affluent, the Bandaranaike Memorial International Conference Hall (BMICH)- an outright gift to Sri Lanka from the People's Republic of China.

• **Negombo** situated by the shores has been a trading port for Portuguese and Dutch. Attractions in the city are the old Dutch fort gate built in 1672 now a part of the prison, the Dutch Canal which was then a supply route to the Dutch administration, old churches and fishing villagers. The 100km long canal running through the town is still being used and is an attraction for those who want to see the country from a different perspective. The stretch of road towards Kottchikade comes to life at dusk (most shops are open at daytime too) with many handicrafts and curio shops, gem shops and restaurants. Fine beach stretches are superbly maintained by the hotels while some are always busy with fisherman and their equipment. Equipment for water sports such as diving, wind surfing are available at most hotels.
